POINTS

Points will be tallied in a “golf style inverted” meaning the driver with the lowest points will win the championship.

Points given for Finishing position. P1 = 1 Point

Points given for Race incident Penalties.

PENALTIES

Avoidable contact 4x - .5 points to Championship Standings

Avoidable Major contact 4x (more than two cars involved) - 1 point to Championship Standings

IN GAME COMMS Violation- .5 points to Championship Standings

Discord league chat Violation - .5 points to Championship points

Intentional Wrecking- Admin Reviewed/ Removed from League

No attendance- Max grid points

PROTESTS/DEBRIEF

Debrief will be held in post review chat. With @elzonthasim888 , @jdracing.12, Oliver Brooks, or TJ Yankee. Drivers can use the text chat in the voice channel to ask questions and note certain incidents. Please be respectful in chat. All appeals must be submitted to the Race Officials, via a discord post only, within 48 hours of the race end. Incident submittals and appeal results will be posted in discord within 72 hours with the decision.

1. MEMBER CONDUCT AND EXPECTATIONS

1.1 Text and Voice Communication

League members must “remain Professional” when it comes to public text and voice communication. Profanity use and abusive language will not be tolerated. League Members may receive penalty and or suspension due to misuse of text and voice communication.

1.2 Hate Speech

Absolutely no abusive/hate speech will be tolerated. **THIS IS YOUR ONLY WARNING.** If you are subjected to any form of abuse or hate speech, report it to the league administrators immediately.

1.3 Self and Brand Promotion

Content creators participating in the active season are welcome to post links to their live streams or other social media and content. The content must be league related or adjacent to the purpose of the league. The league admins reserve the discretion to block content if the frequency of posting is abused.

2. TERMINOLOGY AND DEFINITIONS

2.1 Track

The Track is the asphalt surface between the white painted lines, up to and including the painted rumble strips. Additional information can be found in the Rules tab in the race session.

2.2 Pit Lane

Pit Lane is the parallel lane next to the racetrack where teams or drivers service their cars, accessed via an entry/exit on the main straight, with strict speed limits enforced.

2.3 Pit Entry

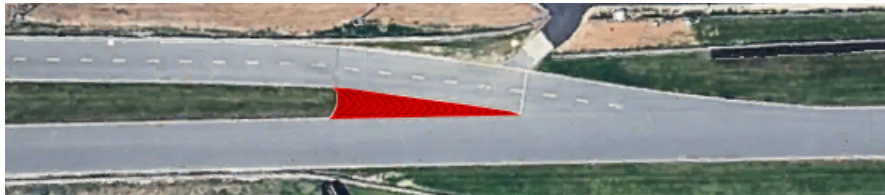
The stretch of asphalt that exits the Track before reaching Pit Lane



(e.g. Road America Pit Entry highlighted in red.)

2.4 Pit Commit

The painted line(s) and/or painted section designating the split between the Track and Pit Entry.



(e.g. Road America Pit Commit section highlighted in red.)

2.5 Pit Exit

A run of asphalt that merges onto the Track when rejoining from Pit Lane.



(e.g. Road America Pit Exit highlighted in red.)

3. ON TRACK CONDUCT

3.1 iRacing Sporting Code

Drivers must follow the iRacing Sporting Code.

No intentional wrecking

- Any deliberate contact or retaliation will not be tolerated. No blocking or dangerous moves

- One defensive move is allowed; erratic or reactionary blocking is prohibited. Race with respect

- Respect fellow drivers, give racing room when warranted, and understand that mistakes happen. Clean driving first

3.2 Practice and Qualifying

Drivers must abide by the iRacing Sporting Code to ensure the track environment is kept safe and competitive. Car to car racing or battling during these sessions is strictly prohibited.

3.3 Race

3.3.2 Starting Procedure

The driver awarded pole position is in control of the field and may accelerate to begin the race only after the pace car has entered Pit Lane but before the green flag/lights.

3.3.4 Race Standards

Drivers are afforded 13 incident points before they incur a drive through penalty automatically triggered by iRacing. Drivers will incur an additional drive through penalty for every additional 5 incident points.

3.3.5 Overtaking

It is the responsibility of the passing car to make a safe overtake with little to no contact. For any contact made for at least 1x contact incident points, the passing car must return the position. (0x is okay)

3.3.7 Commitment to Pitting

Drivers shall use Pit Entry only and shall not cross over Pit Commit from the Track to Pit Entry, once in Pit Entry drivers shall not cross Pit Commit to rejoin the Track.

3.3.8 Damaged Vehicles and Towing

Drivers given a Meatball Flag may attempt to drive their vehicle to Pit Lane. However if that cannot be done safely, the driver must tow the vehicle.

3.4.3 Blue Flag

Drivers that receive a Blue Flag shall continue driving their normal racing line, allowing the overtaking driver to make the decision of when to pass. It's advised that Blue Flagged drivers do not move off the racing line or slow down to facilitate the pass.

5.1.10 In-Game Voice Chat

All drivers are required to have the in-game voice chat turned ON to receive instruction from Race Control. Drivers must keep the voice communication clear and free from chatter.

4. ODYESSY MOTORSPORT TV PAINT POLICY

ALL PROHIBITED :

Tobacco/Cigarettes

Paint schemes promoting any tobacco, cigarette, or vapour products are prohibited in accordance with the Tobacco and Vaping Products Act. This includes simply displaying logos, such as the famous Marlboro paint schemes.

Questionable/NSFW Content

Paint schemes promoting NSFW websites, locations, etc, are prohibited at all times. This includes parody paint schemes, e.g. "CornHub". Nudity is prohibited on paint schemes at any time, even if censored.

Politics

Paint schemes with political statements, parties, politicians or otherwise are prohibited at all times, as we wish to keep our broadcasts focused on racing only. Paint schemes that simply display a nation's flag or other national symbols, like a Canadian maple leaf, or a star-spangled banner across the car, are acceptable, provided no political statements or figures are attached to them.

Gambling

Paint schemes promoting gambling or gambling-style organizations of any kind are prohibited at all times, due to the presence of persons under the age of 19 watching the streams.

AI Generated Artwork

Paint schemes created using AI regeneration software, or promoting programs that specialize in this technology, are prohibited due to ethical objections regarding art theft, and complex copyright law.

5. ATTENDANCE POLICY

Consistent participation is key to keeping our racing experience competitive and enjoyable:

0/2 Attendance without Check In/Out: 1 Warning

0/3 Attendance with Check In/Out: REMOVED

Drivers who fail to meet these attendance requirements may be removed from the league unless proper communication has been made with staff. Please note — any driver removed for attendance reasons will not receive a refund.

6. LIVERY CONTEST

Livery Contest will be held in the last race (FINALE) .Drivers who choose to participate in livery contests must adhere to OMTV Policy (See 4).

7. REFUND POLICY

Once a driver is registered, all payments are final. If a driver chooses to withdraw or is removed from the season for any reason, no refund will be provided. This is due to the slot reserved by your payment.
